Building Projects:

We have a number of building projects getting underway very soon. The builders have started fencing off areas they will work in. The work is in a number of areas so they will move around the school as they complete each stage. The projects include:

- Repairs to the beams that hold up the deck to the Kauri classes
- Removal of the glass panels in the roofing above the Kauri classes and beside the hall
- Upgrade of the Kauri classrooms
- Replace vinyl and install new taps in the toilets beside the old computer suite
- Upgrade the computer suite which will become the library
- Create a permanent office for LSC, in the current space, and a second office in the space
- Screening to the top deck of Ngā Huiarau
- Kitchen upgrade in the hall

These are all Ministry of Education funded projects as part of our property programme.
