Maths:

Thank you to everyone who was able to attend our Maths evening last week. We were pleased to share our Maths programme with you. Ōhope Beach School has been working closely with Charlotte Wilkinson over the last 2 years to structure and develop our Maths programme. All classes in the school use the Wilkie Way to screen, assess and plan our Maths programmes in class. After initial screening, at the beginning of each year, the focus of learning spans a 2 year cycle incorporating all areas of Maths, including number knowledge, operations, geometry, measurement and fractions.

Ways to support your child in developing their Maths understanding and fluency include talking and discussing any maths you are doing in your everyday life - cooking, shopping, travelling, working out if something will fit, shapes and sizes you see, days of the week, months of the year, time telling.

Play games with your children - card games, board games such as uno, dice games such as Yahtzee. Most important of all help your child to feel confident and happy using Maths in all situations, help them to have a go and praise attempts.

Cross Country:

On Tuesday we hosted the Interschool cross country. Congratulations to all our runners who competed with pride and perseverance. The weather was great, and the children appreciated all the support they received as they competed. Next Thursday we have 27 children competing in the EBoP event at Woodlands School in Opatiki.

Ōhope Beach School In Zone & Out of Zone Enrolments Applications

The Board invites applications from parents who wish to enrol their children at Ōhope Beach School for term three and four of the 2024 school year (22 July 2024 onwards).

Enrolment at Ōhope Beach School is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available on the school website or from the school office.

Students who live in the home zone are entitled to enrol at the school. Parents of students who live within the home zone should also apply by this date to assist the school to plan appropriately.

The exact number of places available, for out of zone students, will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone.

The deadline for receipt of completed applications for out-of-zone places is 2.30pm on Monday 1st July 2024.

If a ballot is required, it will be held on **Wednesday 3rd July 2024**. Parents will be informed of the ballot within three school days of the ballot being held.

Pitopito Korero:

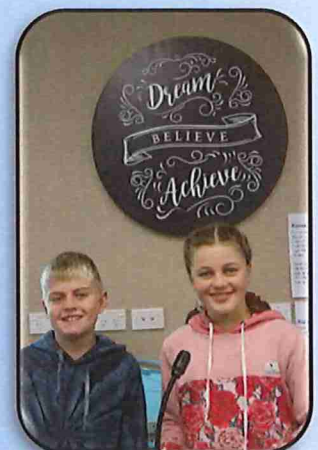
