The staffing for the 2025 school year is based on the enrolments we have and the children we have attending school during the year. This information is collected by the Ministry of Education on the 1st July each year.

Bike Track Upgrade:

We are planning to upgrade the bike track at school for the children. Currently the track gets very muddy after rain and the children cannot use it. It has also become very slippery as the surface has compacted over time. We plan to concrete the track, so it is available for use by bikes, scooters, skateboards and roller skates. We have been successful with an application to NZCT, we have received \$15,000 towards the project. We are waiting on the outcome of another application so that we can get this project underway.
