Sore throats matter and can lead to rheumatic fever

Rheumatic fever is a disease which causes inflammation, especially of the heart, blood vessels and joints. If you are Māori, <code>Bacifika</code> or if you have a family history of rheumatic fever you are more at risk of developing rheumatic fever from a sore throat.

If you are in these high-risk groups and get a sore throat, we recommend you and your whānau have their throats swabbed and treated with antibiotics to prevent rheumatic fever. This service is provided from your Hauora, GP, selected schools and also provided at the above pharmacies. The antibiotics will help get rid of the bacteria from your throats which can cause rheumatic fever.


